Started in 2017 with the goal of gathering 40 Queers folks and allies, the inaugural Summit in Seattle exceeded all expectations with over 140 attendees, 16

speakers and 18 sponsors. Since its first year, the Summit has hosted 61 speakers, as many workshops and almost 500 attendees all focused on creating connections and amplifying the experiences of stories of the Queer community OUTside.
